

Trash Sorting and Disposal Instructions

Please separate your garbage thoroughly and co-operate in reducing the amount of waste.

Please check the collection day on the back of these instructions and fill in the collection day in your area.


Burnable Trash

Collection Day
Twice a Week

Please put out your trash
by 8 a.m. in the morning on every

Kitchen Waste




Vegetables, fruit scraps, leftovers, fish, shellfish
Please drain kitchen garbage well.

Plastic Containers and Packaging




Confectionery bags, polyethylene bags, plastic wrap, egg packs, unrecyclable PET bottles, etc.

Other Plastics




CDs, DVDs, toys, cassette tapes, stockings, styrofoam, plastic bottle lids

Household Waste Cooking Oil




Use a rag to soak up the oil or solidify it with a coagulant.

Paper Waste




Tissue paper, oil paper, vinyl-coated paper, laminated paper such as gold pasting, unrecyclable paper such as carbon paper.

Rubber, Leather




Bags, school bags, shoes, balls, boots, rubber gloves, slippers, etc.

Wood Waste



Please cut wood waste into small pieces and take the leaves off pruned branches. (Length of about 50cm, thickness of about 10cm or less per piece)
Do not put it into a bag, but tie up into a manageable bundle.

Unrecyclable Fibers



Cotton clothes, underwear, socks, curtains, quilted clothing, cushions, pillows, stuffed animals, futons, disposable diapers

- Please put it in the **trash bag designated by Sakuragawa City** and tie the bag up well.
- For food waste disposal at home, please use compost.
- Do not use cardboard boxes as trash containers, and do not put paper, **cans and bottles** that can be recycled into burnable trash.
- Collection occurs even on public holidays. Please check the city's PR magazine for collection during the New Year holidays.

How to Sort **Recyclable Trash**

Newspapers, Leaflets



Approx. 1 month's worth of newspapers and leaflets should be folded into quarters and tied into a bundle (approx. 60cm high, approx. 8kg weight).

Paper Cartons



Milk cartons, juice, etc. Tie into a bundle of about 20~30 packs. **Excludes liquor packs with silver backs.**

Cardboard boxes



Fold cardboard into a size approx. 60~80 cms and tie into a bundle with a height of approx. 20cm. **Remove foreign materials such as adhesive tape.**

Magazines



Tie into a bundle. (Height approx. 30cm)

Miscellaneous Papers



Put thin paper into a bag and tie into a bundle. (Height approx. 20cm)

Fibers



Unrecyclable clothing and small fabrics other than textiles should be wrapped in a large cloth and bundled. (Approx. 40cm², height approx. 40cm)

Clear Bottles



Drink bottles, etc. **Excludes bottles of pesticides, harmful substances, and cosmetics.** Remove the lid, empty the inside and wash with water. Sort bottles into colorless, green, and brown.

Brown Bottles



Beer bottles, whiskey bottles, etc.

Green Bottles



Japanese sake bottles, etc.

PET Bottles



Soft drinks, liquor containers. **Excludes bottles of oil** Remove the lid and label, empty the inside and wash with water.

Steel Cans




Empty the inside and wash with water.

Aluminum Cans




How to Sort **Unburnable Trash**

Glass




Ashtrays, glass vases, oil, agriculture, cosmetics bottles, incandescent bulbs, LED bulbs, miniature light bulbs, glow lamps, glasses, lenses, etc.
Put the broken trash in a bag and throw it away. Empty the bottle and wash it with water.

Ceramics




Teacups, plates, flower pots, ceramic vases

Small Appliances



Hot water pot, radio, cassette players, rice cookers, irons, circulator fans, etc.
It must be small enough to fit in a bag. Remove removable or rechargeable batteries from devices such as cordless vacuum cleaners. Dispose of removed batteries and rechargeable batteries in hazardous waste.

Metals




Pans, kettles, aluminum foil, empty cans that cannot be recycled, etc.

How to Dispose of Dangerous Trash


Please dispose of recyclable trash and non-burnable trash during the given collection times.

Cutlery, Pottery Broken Glass




Please put in a bag, etc.

Razor and cutter blades, drawing pins, needles




Please put into a container with a lid, such as a plastic container or can.

Disposable Lighters



Since there is a risk of ignition, separate it and put it in a transparent bag.


Spray Cans



Make a hole in a well-ventilated place and crush the can so that you can see the hole.


How to Sort **Hazardous Trash**

Batteries




Dry batteries, button-type batteries, rechargeable batteries, or built-in devices (e-cigarettes, mobile batteries, etc.)
Be sure to separate them, as there is a risk of ignition.

Fluorescent Lamps



Straight tube, round, bulbs
Broken fluorescent lamps are discarded along with glass.

Products that include Mercury



Mercury thermometers, mercury blood pressure monitors, etc.

- When disposing of recyclable, unburnable, dangerous trash or hazardous waste, please put it in the designated basket at the collection point.
- Please put unburnable trash in a **special bag for unburnable trash designated by Sakuragawa City**. All trash should be limited to a size that fits into the designated bag.
- Since the collection point is different from burnable trash, if you are newly moving into an apartment, etc., please be sure to consult with a representative of the district and confirm the location. (You can also check the location with the QR code on the back.)
- If the first Sunday of January is the beginning of the year, the collection will be carried out the following week. (For example: A district that collects on the first Sunday of the month will collect on the second Sunday, all subsequent collections will be 1 week late.)
- Recyclables (recyclable trash) are sold and money returned to the community.

Oversize Trash	We plan to collect it four times a year (in May and September for futons and wood, and in June and November for iron, waste plastic, and other). The schedule will be announced in a letter from the mayor and at each government building.
Temporary Large Amount of Garbage	Please bring it to the Environmental Center yourself. For details, please refer to the Environmental Center website. (Paid disposal)
Agricultural Plastic	We are planning to collect it in the city. The schedule will be announced by the Agriculture and Forestry Division in a letter from the mayor.
Business-related trash	Trash generated from business activities ※Excluding industrial waste. → Please ask a licensed contractor from the city or bring it to the Environmental Center yourself. For a list of licensed contractors, please check the city's website.
Others	Hazardous materials (propane gas cylinders, paint, paint thinners, fire extinguishers, chemicals, pesticides, etc.), construction waste, automobile parts, sand, soil, stones, specified home appliances (displays with tuners, TVs, refrigerators, freezers, heat insulators, clothes dryers, washing machines, air conditioners), safes, tires for large vehicles, motorcycles (90cc or more) → Please contact the store where you purchased the product for the disposal method.

- For information about how to dispose of garbage that is not listed, please contact the Community Environment Division.
- All users are responsible for the maintenance of the collection point and should always keep it clean.

Chikusei Municipal Affairs Association Environmental Center
Please bring only general trash during business-trash collection times. Industrial waste cannot be brought in.
